

# 2011 Municipal Activities Report

It can be well defined that 2011 was another year of challenges and achievements for the administration of the Village of Versailles. In addition to meeting the



day-to-day operating needs of the municipal corporation, Mayor Subler and Village Council continue to implement



policies, programs, and projects designed to promote growth and stability in the Community. The Street, Utilities, Police, Fire, and

Emergency Medical Services departments all continue to provide safe, reliable, and affordable service to a growing number of citizens and customers. In summation, 2011 was a year in which the Village Administration



and Employees continued to actively respond to both the current and future needs of the Versailles Community.



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- I.** Construction was initiated on the Safe Routes to School Phase I Project. The project area encompasses the south side of Marker Road (State Route 121) beginning at the South Center Street intersection and proceeds west along Marker Road to the west property line of the Brilliant Beginnings Learning Center. There were also sidewalks constructed along the west side of South Center Street from the Marker Road intersection to the south property line of 642 South Center Street.

Village Council awarded a contract to Milcon Concrete, Inc. at a cost of \$214,939.40. The construction costs for the project will be paid for with a Safe Routes to School Grant awarded to the Village by the Ohio Department of Transportation. The \$290,000.00 grant plus ten percent contingency in the amount of \$29,000 will cover 100% of the construction costs.

Village and School Officials appreciate the continued support from the citizens as infrastructure improvements identified in the local Safe Routes to School Travel Plan are completed to improve the safety for students and pedestrians traveling to and from the Versailles Schools.

- II.** The Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) announced the Village of Versailles had been selected to receive a second Safe Routes to School infrastructure grant in the amount of \$147,859. The grant monies will be used to construct sidewalks, retaining wall, and drainage improvements along the west side of South Center Street to the school driveway along South Center Street across from Cambridge Drive. The project is expected to be constructed and completed during 2012.
- III.** The North West Street Reconstruction Phase I Project was completed during 2011. The project area encompassed North West Street beginning at the CSX railroad and proceeding north along West Street to the Greenlawn Avenue intersection.

Village Council awarded contracts to Double Jay Construction, Inc. in the amount of \$1,113,720, and to C.W. Electric in the amount of \$599,277. Funding for the project was provided by \$1,183,829 in grants awarded to the Village of Versailles, \$70,561 of ODOT funding, \$32,610 in property owner assessments, while the remaining \$425,997 being paid from Village funds generated by the ½% local income tax collections and electric system improvements costs being paid from electric fund revenues.

- IV.** The West Ward Street Improvements Phase II Project was also completed during 2011. The project area encompassed West Ward Street beginning at the Franklin Street intersection and proceeding west along Ward Street to the Grand Avenue intersection.

Village Council awarded a contracts to Tumbusch Construction, Inc. in the amount of \$457,276, and to Vaughn Industries in the amount of \$184,665. Funding for the project was provided by \$79,759 in property owner assessments while the remaining \$562,182 being paid from Village funds generated by the ½% local income tax collections, and electric system improvements costs being paid from electric fund revenues.

- V.** Various parts of the Village saw annual street maintenance activities continue with the completion of the 2011 Street Maintenance Project. The project provided for asphalt milling and resurfacing along seven local streets and was completed by Freisthler Paving, Inc. at a cost of \$202,573. The 2011 street maintenance was paid for with monies collected from the Village's local ½% income tax.
- VI.** A dedication and open house for the wastewater treatment plant facility improvements was held during 2011.

The Village's wastewater treatment facilities were originally constructed in 1939, with significant upgrades occurring in 1964, and again in 1988. The 1988 improvements were designed and constructed based on 20 year growth projections. A design average flow of 350,000 gallons per day with a peak hourly flow of 920,000 gallons per day were the hydraulic design benchmarks established in 1988.

With the expansion and upgrades being completed that were designed considering a 20-year horizon, the Village is now provided the capacity to treat 750,000 gallons per day average flow with a peak hourly flow of 4,500,000 gallons. The upgraded treatment facilities are also designed to provide for future expansion to achieve an average daily flow of 1,500,000 gallons with a peak hourly flow of 6,000,000 gallons.

The total cost of the project is \$8,800,000. Funding for the project was provided by a \$4,473,000 American Recovery and Reinvestment Act stimulus grant, a \$1,000,000 zero percent interest loan through the Ohio Public Works Commission, and the balance of \$3,327,000 with a 1% interest loan through the Ohio Water Pollution Control Loan Fund.

- VII.** The Versailles Area Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors approved a \$20,000, zero percent interest loan to the Village of Versailles for the extension of a natural gas main line to serve the Versailles Industrial Park North property along Baker Road.

The extension of the natural gas main line will provide natural gas service for the Industrial Park North property and result in the Village having available “shovel ready” sites for attracting business development projects. When businesses are looking to expand or locate to an industrial park site it is very important to have all utilities available at the site and be ready to serve the business development project. The natural gas main line extension to the Baker Road property will enhance the features to further the attraction of business and industry expansion projects that generate new investments and result in creating and/or retaining jobs for the Versailles community.

The recent action exercised by the Versailles Area Chamber to approve the infrastructure improvements loan demonstrates the collaborative and cooperative partnership that exists between the Village Council and Chamber to maintain and promote economic development.

- VIII.** Village of Versailles electric utility customers were presented with an Energy Efficiency Smart Program in 2011. Efficiency Smart is a comprehensive energy efficiency program administered for American Municipal Power, Inc. (AMP) by the Vermont Energy Investment Corporation (VEIC) based in Columbus, Ohio,

The goal of the initial three year program for the Village of Versailles electric utility system is to reduce electricity consumption by 756 megawatt hours annually. The energy savings to the Village is estimated to be more than \$950,000 over the life of the efficiency measures that are installed through the program.

- IX.** During 2011, the Village completed the installation of a new replacement slide and the addition of a new second smaller slide within the playground area at Indian Creek Park. The slides were purchased at a cost of \$6,334.

To assist with paying for the costs associated with the playground improvement project, the Village of Versailles was awarded a grant in the amount of \$3,000 from the Darke County Park District through the Darke County Parks Community Parks Improvement Program. In addition to the grant award the Village received a donation from the Trash-is-Cash for the balance of \$3,334.

Since the inception of the Community Parks Improvement Program, the Park District has distributed over \$615,000 in grant funds to community parks across Darke County. Versailles area residents have been very fortunate to see the benefits of over \$38,400 in park grant monies awarded to the Village’s Ward and Indian Creek Parks.

- X.** Village Council extended well-deserved recognition to the local Trash-is-Cash organization for the multiple donations the lady volunteers have made to the Village for two major improvement projects that have been completed at Ward Park. The Trash-is-Cash donated \$60,030 to the Ward Park Playground Improvement Project and donated \$172,065 to the Ward Park Swimming Pool Project.

Over the past sixteen years the Trash-is-Cash has donated \$467,514 to a number of community organizations and projects. Just about any organization you can think of or any community project that has been undertaken in Versailles you will find the footprints of the Trash-is-Cash lady volunteers where monies they have generated were donated to the organization or project. Thank you “Trashy Ladies” volunteers for your generous contributions towards enhancing the quality of life throughout the Village and for playing such a significant part in maintaining Versailles as a wonderful community to call home.

- XI.** During 2011 the Village working in cooperation with the Darke County Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Management received a grant to help fund the installation of a fourth outdoor tornado warning siren along Marker Road along in front of the Versailles Schools. The cost of the siren project amounted to \$21,285 with the Village being reimbursed \$10,642.50 through the grant awarded for the project.

The following represents the major legislative, executive, and administrative activities undertaken in 2011:

1. On January 12<sup>th</sup>, Council adopted Ordinance No. 10-44, adopting adjusted rates, terms, and conditions for electric service provided by the Village of Versailles, as outlined for 2011 in the Electric Cost of Service and Rate Study Report recently completed for the Village.

3. Finally on January 12<sup>th</sup>, Council adopted Resolution No. 11-02, authorizing the Fiscal Officer to re-advertise for bids for the North West Street Phase I Electric Services Upgrade Project, and declaring an emergency.
4. On January 26<sup>th</sup>, Council adopted Ordinances Nos. 11-05, 11-06, and 11-07, approving, adopting, and enacting the 2011 edition of the Ohio Model Municipal Code - Administration Code, Traffic Code, and General Offenses Code, respectively, as revised through September 10, 2010.
5. On February 9<sup>th</sup>, Council adopted Resolution No. 11-09, authorizing the Fiscal Officer to advertise for bids for the North West Street Reconstruction Phase I Project.
6. On February 23<sup>rd</sup>, Council adopted Resolution Nos. 11-03 and 11-04, authorizing the sale of a 1990 Ford F Series Econoline 350 XL Diesel Ambulance and a 1967 C95 Mack Thermo Dyne Diesel Fire Truck, respectively, not needed for any municipal purpose.
7. Also on February 23<sup>rd</sup>, Council adopted Ordinance No. 11-11, adopting updated rates, terms, and conditions for electric service provided by the Village of Versailles, and declaring an emergency.
8. On March 9<sup>th</sup>, Council adopted Resolution No. 11-08, authorizing the Fiscal Officer to advertise for bids for the 2011 Street Maintenance Project.
9. On March 23<sup>rd</sup>, Council adopted Resolution No. 11-10, authorizing the sale of certain vehicles and equipment not needed for any municipal purpose.
10. Also on March 23<sup>rd</sup>, Council adopted Ordinance No. 11-14, adopting the 2011 Annual Appropriations and Ordinance No. 11-15, authorizing the transfer of funds from the General Fund and Income Tax Fund, as provided in the 2011 Annual Appropriations, and declaring an emergency.

12. Finally on March 23<sup>rd</sup>, Council adopted Ordinance No. 11-17, approving a loan agreement with the Versailles Area Chamber of Commerce, and declaring an emergency.
13. On April 27<sup>th</sup>, Council adopted Ordinance No. 11-12, adopting updated flood damage reduction regulations for the Village.
14. Also on April 27<sup>th</sup>, Council adopted Resolution No. 11-13, authorizing the Village Administrator to file a grant application with the Darke County Park District for the purpose of acquiring grant funds through the Community Parks Improvement Grant Program.
15. Finally on April 27<sup>th</sup>, Council adopted Resolution No. 11-22, approving a Community Reinvestment Area Agreement between the Village and Versailles Savings & Loan Company, and Resolution No. 11-23, approving a Community Reinvestment Area Compensation Agreement between the Village of Versailles, Versailles Exempted Village Schools, and Versailles Savings & Loan Company.
16. On May 11<sup>th</sup>, Council adopted Ordinance No. 11-18, granting consent to the Ohio Department of Transportation, Director of Transportation, to complete Project DAR-SR47-19-40, resurfacing State Route 47 within the Village, and rescinding Ordinance No. 08-35.
17. Also on May 11<sup>th</sup>, Council adopted Resolution No. 11-19, authorizing the Fiscal Officer to advertise for bids for the Safe Routes to School Phase I Project.
18. On June 9<sup>th</sup>, Council adopted Resolution No. 11-24, authorizing the Village Administrator to file a grant application with the Ohio Public Works Commission requesting funds for the North West Street Reconstruction Phase II Project.
19. On June 21<sup>st</sup>, Council adopted Ordinance No. 11-25, to approve the form and authorize the execution of a power sales contract with American Municipal Power, Inc. and taking other actions in connection therewith regarding participation in the AMP Fremont Energy Center.
20. Also on June 21<sup>st</sup>, Council adopted Resolution No. 11-27, approving a Contract Addendum be entered into with Rumpke of Ohio, Inc. for the disposal of municipal solid waste and recyclable materials.
21. On July 13<sup>th</sup>, Council adopted Resolution No. 11-26, authorizing participation in the Ohio Department of Transportation Cooperative Purchasing Program.
22. On July 27<sup>th</sup>, Council adopted Resolution No. 11-31, approving a memorandum of understanding agreement between the Village of Versailles and the Darke County Board of Commissioners.
23. On August 10<sup>th</sup>, Council adopted Resolution No. 11-28 and Resolution No. 11-32, authorizing assessment of cost by the Village of Versailles.
24. Also on August 10<sup>th</sup>, Council adopted Resolution No. 11-29, authorizing the Fiscal Officer to advertise for bids for the Safe Routes to School Phase I Improvements Project.
25. Finally on August 10<sup>th</sup>, Council adopted Resolution No. 11-30, authorizing the Fiscal Officer to advertise for bids for the Swamp Creek Channel Protection Project.
26. On September 28<sup>th</sup>, Council adopted Ordinance No. 11-34, amending the 2011 Annual Appropriations, and declaring an emergency.

27. On October 12<sup>th</sup>, Council adopted Resolution No. 11-35, adopting the Darke County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation 5-Year Plan Update, and declaring an emergency.
28. Also on October 12<sup>th</sup>, Council adopted Resolution No. 11-36, authorizing participation in the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Flood Mitigation Assistance Program, and declaring an emergency.
29. On November 9<sup>th</sup>, Council adopted Resolution No. 11-42, opposing Centralized Municipal Income Tax Collections by the State of Ohio, and declaring an emergency.
30. On November 21<sup>st</sup>, Council adopted Resolution Nos. 11-37, 11-38, and 11-44, authorizing the Mayor and the Fiscal Officer to enter into contracts with Wayne, Richland, and York Townships, respectively, for fire protection.

- ll. Recommended the sale of the Village's share of renewable energy credits for the years 2012-2014 associated with the Belleville Hydroelectric Power Supply Resource.
- mm. Accepted the Village's apportionment of the Local Government Monies for 2012, as allocated by the Darke County Budget Commission.

- nn. Awarded the bid for the Safe Routes to School Phase I Improvements Project (sidewalk installation along Marker Road) to Milcon Construction, Inc. at a cost of \$214,939.40.

- ss. Accepted, with appreciation, a \$3,334 donation from the Trash-is-Cash Recreational Facility Fund for improvements at the Indian Creek Park Playground.
- tt. Approved the establishment of a policy for providing emergency service vehicle escorts for school organizations.
- uu. Approved a 2012 pledge payment of \$15,000 to the Darke County Economic Development Partnering for Progress Program.

The following planning & zoning activities occurred in 2011:

A total of 19 zoning permits were issued for a combined construction valuation of \$1,340,632. This includes 13 residential permits and 6 commercial permits.

The Board of Zoning Appeals reviewed 4 zoning variance applications. The Planning Commission reviewed 2 minor subdivision applications.

The following annual and departmental reports were submitted to Village Council:

I. Utilities Department Report:

- A. The Village continues to keep municipal electric customers supplied with affordable and reliable electric service. Electric power purchases totaling \$3,506,078 were made through American Municipal Power-Ohio, Inc.

Additional electric power was purchased from Dayton Power and Light Company at a total cost (including transmission charges) of \$174,717.

- B. A total of 132,191,000 gallons of water and 174,291,000 gallons of wastewater were treated in 2011.
- C. The Refuse Department collected 1,485 tons of solid waste and 228 tons of commingled recyclables in 2011.
- D. A total of 146 tons of cardboard were collected by the Village in 2011.
- E. The Utilities Department received a Safety Award, a System Improvement Award, and an Environmental Stewardship Award during the annual American Municipal Power Conference.
- F. The Village of Versailles was designated a Tree City USA for the 13<sup>th</sup> consecutive year by the Ohio Department of Natural Resources, Division of Forestry.

- II. In 2011, Fiscal Officer, Mary Ann Gump, invested Village funds which earned interest income in the amount of \$39,961. Investments continue to be made by the Village which produce additional revenues for the Village that help offset the need for additional tax levy increases.
- III. During 2011, the Village of Versailles received a total of \$838,306 in grant monies.
- IV. Income Tax Administrator, Robin Henry, reported a total of \$1,825,841 in municipal income taxes were collected in 2011.

As promised by the Street & Safety Committee and Village Council, proceeds from the additional income tax collections (1/2%) were used for the West Wood Street Phase II Improvement Project, North West Street Improvement Project, and the 2011 Street Maintenance Project. Mayor Subler and Village Council Members extend their sincere appreciation to the citizens of Versailles for their support of continued improvements throughout the community.

- V. The Fire Department reported a total of 88 emergency runs during 2011, with the dollar amount of damage totaling \$1,750,000.
- VI. The Emergency Medical Services Department reported a total of 355 emergency runs during 2011.
- VII. The Police Department reported a total of 2,082 calls for service throughout 2011.
- VIII. During 2011, Ward and Indian Creek Parks continued to provide recreational opportunities for Village residents of the surrounding area. A total of 37 reservations were reported for the use of park shelter houses.
- IX. The Village's Greenlawn Cemetery reported a total of 16 burials throughout 2011.
- X. The Village's Swimming Pool reported a total of 264 season passes being purchased during 2011.

The following major purchases were approved by Council in 2011:

1. Extrication Rescue Equipment (Jaws of Life) for the Fire and Emergency Medical Services Departments from Finley Fire Equipment at a cost of \$21,456.00 with \$15,000 of this purchase funded with a donation from the Trash-is-Cash.
2. Video security system for the Emergency Services Facility from SecurCom at a cost of \$13,630.48.
3. Two in-car cameras for the Police Department with 3-year extended warranties and installation at a cost of \$10,860.00.
4. Purchased a replacement pickup truck for the Street & Water Department at a cost of \$26,943.00.
5. Purchased a replacement utility tractor for the Street & Utility Department at a cost of \$26,825.00.

As can be evidenced by this list of activities and accomplishments 2011 was a very active and productive year for the administration and employees of the Village of Versailles. These accomplishments are also further evidence of the Village Council's commitment to a safe and prosperous future in 2012 and beyond. In summation, the overall success obtained throughout the Village during 2011 shall be considered a positive and bright reflection on the community motto . . . **PEOPLE-PRIDE-PROGRESS.**
